David Kahler, and the Quadracci

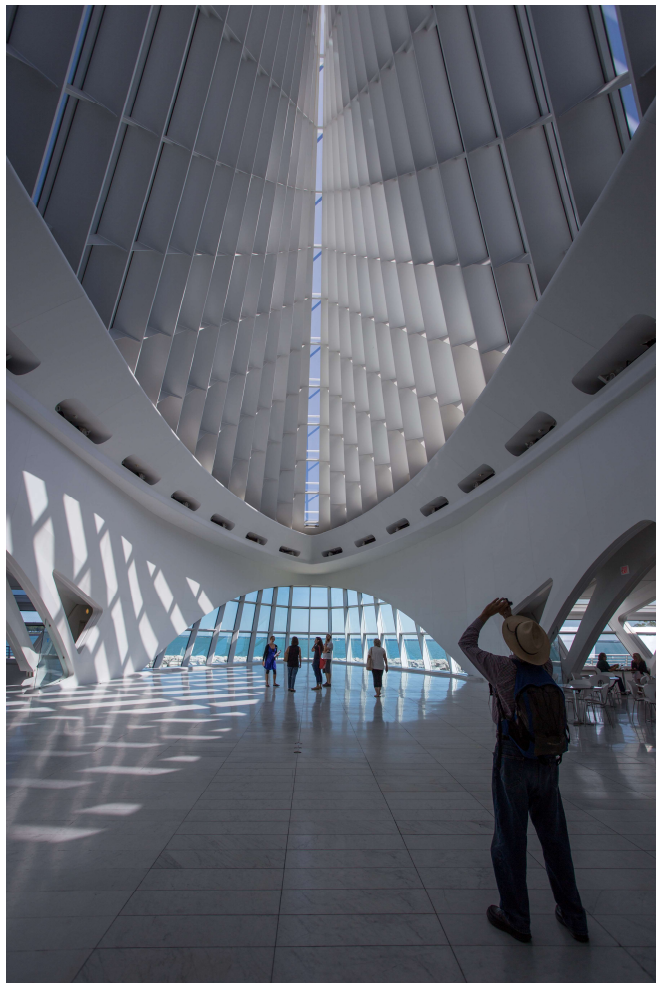
Pavilion created by Spanish
